



HINCHINGBROOKE TRAIL

This is a circular walk around Hinchingbrooke and could take up to an hour depending on if you stop and play in the park. Anyone can do this BUT if you live on Hinchingbrooke and want a chance to win a family prize please drop your answers (with a £1 donation) to 1 The Shrubbery or 24 Dartmoor before 9am on 4th June

START – you can start from any point as long as you follow the same directions it's a circular route

Starting at the bus stop by Hinchingbrooke Hospital

1.If you wanted to travel to St Neots what is the bus number you need to take?

Go Past the bus stop. Turn right at the roundabout.

2. What is the speed limit here?

Cross the road safely, using the crossing turning right, follow the path past the school.

3. There is a sign on the left. What animal is mentioned?

Follow the path around into Cromwell Drive.

4. What is the name of the Shop? And the Takeaway?

Keep walking down Cromwell drive and you will see a play park. 

5. How many swings are there in the park and what is missing?


Keeping the park on your left walk through the alleyway taking a look at number 74 on your right.

6. What interesting thing is on their plant pots (do not go onto their property)

Once through the gap you will be in Parkway. Cross the road safely, turn left towards Flamsteed on your right you will see a green electricity box

7. What is the number on this box?


Turn right


8. The first road on the right is named after a comet what is this road called? 

Carry on down Flamsteed and on the right you will get to a play park.

9. How many rungs/ steps are on the slide? What animals are the rockers?

10. Heading up the path a word is written. What is it?

Keep travelling up the path way. This has a lot of wildlife look out for the squirrels , friendly robin and lots of butterflies. You may see some animals that usually belong in the jungle. 

11. On this path how many lampposts are there and what animals did you spot? 

At the end of the path it splits into two. (you will see a bin) Take a left and then head left again going past this



road sign on your left. You will now be in the Shrubbery. Turn right

12. Number 1 and 2 The Shrubbery have stone pets on their front gardens what are they? (do not enter the gardens)

Turn right at the end of Shrubbery into Woodlands and then left down Woodlands until the road narrows. At this point turn right.

13. There is a sign on your right for the Glades . What numbers do they have on it? Follow the path heading left

14. On your right there is some life saving equipment what is it? (it is orange)

Keep following the path keeping an eye out to the left you will see some black and white pillars.

15. How many pillars are there?

Keep going along the path and on the grass on right you will see some wooden items.

16. What are the these wooden food items? Turn right you are now in Christie Drive.

Walking along this road at the end, on your right is a large bungalow. 17. What is its name?

Cross the road safely. Heading right, then left past the litter bin

Cross the road safely at the crossing point.

Head down Hinchingbrooke park Road until you get to a street on right.

18. On your right what indoor sport/ hobby is mentioned in the street name?

Head down the road until you get to the post box.

19. What is the time for the Saturday letter collection?
